



The Air Force Academy is open to the public for both on and off campus activities on trails on the Academy. However, in the event of heightened security measures, bicyclists may be restricted from entering or required to leave the Academy at any time at the Academy's discretion. Bicyclists shall present photo identification to gain access to the Academy at all times. Note: Bicyclists are required to wear approved bicycle helmets while riding on the Academy property.

Public parking is located outside the Air Force Academy's North Entrance, which is adjacent to the Santa Fe Trail, which runs north-south through the Academy. Note: Current parking in the North Entrance parking lot may be asked by Air Force Academy personnel to provide registration and proof of insurance, and vehicles are subject to search.

Bicycling is allowed on Peterson Air Force Base, however, it is a closed installation with no public thoroughfare. Access is for approved personnel only and is obtained through a valid military ID or entry authorization lists only.

The Pikes Peak Highway is open to bicyclists. Riders required to ride single file at all times. Obey all traffic regulations. No pull-behind trailers or campers regardless of size. Bicyclists can ride down the Pikes Peak Highway if they are part of an approved tour group through either of the two local commercial bicycle tour companies currently approved to offer such rides - Challenge Unlimited (1-800-736-5064 / www.bikehike.com) or Pikes Peak Mountain Bike Tours (1-888-593-3062 / www.bikebours.com).

Mountain biking is allowed on trail near the two reservoirs along the Pikes Peak Highway; however, bicyclists must bring their bicycles up via a motor vehicle. There is a access fee to the Pikes Peak Highway - the summer fee is \$72 per adult (16 years and above) the winter fee is \$10 per adult (16 years and above).

Bicycling is allowed on NORAD, however, it is a closed installation with no public thoroughfare. Access is for approved personnel only and is obtained through a valid military ID or entry authorization lists only.

Bicycling is allowed on Fort Carson, however, the post is a closed installation with no public thoroughfare. Only persons with a valid military ID, a military retiree, or Department of Defense (DOD) civilian employees and approved contractors doing work at Fort Carson may enter the post.
